
Utilizing an Old-Fashioned Flat-iron as an Anvil

simply stapling it to the workbench as shown in the diagram, in which A is the body of the iron, C the handle, D the bench top, and B, B, staples to hold the handle in po-


sition. If a slot is cut in the bench top, fairly heavy work can be done on it.—James Mullen, Jr.
